# Counting the Cost

- Domestic Violence: 28% women physical or sexual violence from an intimate partner (from 2013). Economic cost - \$13.6 billion
- Child Abuse: 1 in 37 received CP orders. Indigenous children 7 x (AIHW, 2015). Economic cost \$4 billion plus \$6.7 billion
- Elder Abuse: 3-5% (Kurrle 2004) (insert QADA study)
- Abuse & Mistreatment of People with Disabilities: Estimated that 1.5 x more likely (Hughes et al. 2012) & 2 x for women with disabilities (Dowse et al., 2013)
- **2012 Personal Safety Survey** (ABS, 2013): 49% men and 41% women


