

Examining Elder Abuse using a socio-ecological lens: developing targeted interventions

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Elder abuse

14.6% Estimated Prevalence (60 years + in community)₁

Sub-types: Financial (42%) Psychological (35%), Neglect (10%),
Physical (8%), Social (5%), Sexual (0.1%)₂

Perpetrators₂:

95% family members ('trust'); 15% 'non-trust'

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Risk Factors



(Socio)ecological model of risk of Elder Abuse^{3,4}:

- **Individual:** dependency/disability, low income, gender, age, ethnicity/diverse background
- **Perpetrator:** mental health issues, substance abuse, dependency, criminal record, childhood FDV, Pan-violence, education, minority status, social isolation
- **Relationship:** family culture, relationship dynamics
- **Community:** geographical location, degree of service support and availability
- **Societal:** ageist stereotypes, cultural norms

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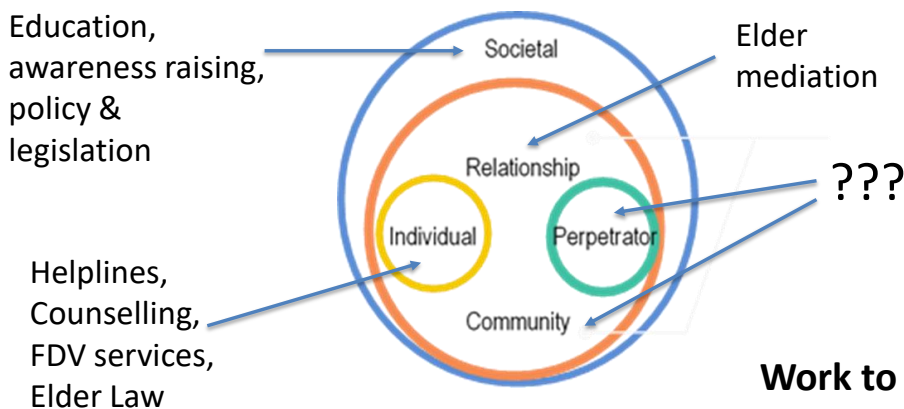
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Elder Abuse Responses
